**SPECIAL ELECTION ON TUESDAY, MAY 8, 2007:** Dayton Public Schools have proposed a school operating levy of \$15 mils which will be up for your vote on the ballot at the upcoming special election in the City of Dayton. If passed, this levy will increase property taxes approximately \$500 per year per \$100,000 of assessed value.

N.A.O. volunteers act as a support unit for the Police Department and its officers. Neighborhood Assistance Officers are trained to handle duties such as: traffic control at emergency scenes, special events, assisting with non-enforcement calls, missing person searches, and noise complaints. They also perform routine patrol of neighborhoods to deter crime.
